

magine what it will be like at the Olympic Stadium at the opening ceremony in 2012. Everything will be at fever pitch and there will be great excitement, huge anticipation and indeed expectations of many victories for us as host nation, in many events. The opening ceremony will have just about every nation on earth taking part, so will expectations be met, will the excitement melt away to be replaced, in the cold light of day by the realism that things are not going to be as the heart wants? Imagine you are in a crowd in Jerusalem two thousand years ago. The word on the street is of a prophet called Jesus who they say is going to overthrow the tyrannical Romans. He will be the new king and there will be Jewish rule again over their own lands and people; imagine the excitement as word spreads of a parade into Jerusalem.

Imagine the almost crushing noise, great vibrancy in everything that is happening. Excitement is at fever pitch and all your senses are being assailed in a very different way to everyday life. All around you people are screaming out hosanna, blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. You look down the street and through the dust you see men dancing and waving their hands in the air, palm branches going up and down and the noise begins to get louder and louder until it reaches a crescendo as a figure appears riding on a donkey; how do you feel now? Imagine your feelings as he trots past. Will he be victorious, is he going to win the gold medal as King, is he going to wear the victor's crown? Imagine the scene just a few days later on a misty hill side. Now there is weeping and wailing as Jesus, Messiah and King hangs limp on a cross. No victory laurel on his head, but rather a crown of thorns so cruelly crushed down on his blood soaked body.

Imagine the pain and emptiness of dreams and hopes dashed again.

Move the clock forward just a couple of days and rumours start to spread that Messiah is not dead after all, but that he has been seen alive again. How? Impossible? But more and more people have seen him; it must be true, please let it be true; don't let it be the end.

Imagine, if you can, where your heart and mind would be at that point. Jesus dead, buried, but now alive! Imagine it is 2012 and the Olympic closing ceremony has just finished. What a fortnight it has been, many winners have been crowned (even some from England) and already the lasting legacy from these games is being spoken about in glowing terms; but only time will tell. At Easter we celebrate the lasting legacy of Jesus Christ who is the Champion for the world, not a sprinter or even a marathon runner, but eternal Champion. These words from the song 'In Christ Alone' say it all:

There in the ground His body lay, light of the world by darkness slain. Then bursting forth in glorious day up from the grave He rose again. And as He stands in victory, sin's curse has lost its grip on me For I am His and He is mine, bought with the precious blood of Christ.

Imagine that. Jesus has died for you and me, but now reigns in heaven, sin defeated, eternal life guaranteed. What a legacy!
