The evening draws in so we ask him to share supper with us and a bed for the night. At table something strange occurs - it is as if he is the host and not us. He breaks bread and pours the wine. Suddenly the scales fall from our eyes! We look into his face which is now glowing with loving kindness and glory. As our hearts thump madly we see now that our journey has not ended but is only just beginning – the journey into the heart of God's new life for us. As you read this, remember the stranger is still here with us. Look into his face, eat bread with Him and continue the journey with Him. Leave the darkness of Good Friday behind.
