magine a young mother looking fondly at her month-old baby.



Shoe Box Evening 12th November

Phew! What a hectic evening the shoe box packing night turned out to be. The hall was a hive of activity with over 40 people, including children, packing boxes with the marvellous selection of items that had been so generously donated by people in the village and beyond. Some people have been knitting hats, scarves and gloves, puppets and



teddy bears all year. Phyllis Little's needles must have been red hot as she produced 50 teddy bears and 50 hats. Toiletries, balls, pens, pencils, paper, sweets, toys - you name it, it was there. At the end of the evening 193 boxes were filled. By the time the boxes were dispatched, this rose to well over

350, including some from the Catholic Women's Meeting, Bishops Stortford Methodist Women's Meeting, and Water Lane URC.

Brian and I took some of our boxes up to the Harlow centre and saw for ourselves what goes on there. They welcome visitors, so if you are shopping in Harlow do pop in, although it may be too late this year as the warehouse closes on 15th December. Once the boxes have been checked, they are packed in cartons of 15 to 20 boxes, and then when they have 750 cartons ready they will be dispatched to Belarus. The large packs of pens and pencils that we could not use will be going to equip a school in Liberia, and the left over woolly hats to children's hospitals and orphanages. Nothing is thrown away!

Donations of money are also very important, as unlike a few years ago when large companies would provide a lorry and a driver to take the boxes abroad, now Samaritan's Purse have to pay for it out of the £2.50 per box suggested donation.

On behalf of all the children who receive the boxes and the Operation Christmas Child team, I would like to say a very big and sincere thank you to everyone who contributed in any way to make this year's appeal once again so successful.
