

magine that you were homeless this Christmas. No bed of your own, no warm lounge with its telly, no meals to plan, no presents to buy or receive; no-one cares about you at all. Your Christmas is totally dependent on other people's generosity.

At Christmas we are a lot more sensitive to the issue of homelessness. The Christ child was actually born into homelessness; our Bible readings tell us, and many of the carols we sing reflect on this. Is this why we find the plight of the homeless so much more painful at Christmas? Or is it the irony of our spending fabulous sums of money on food, drink, presents and for some - travel and holidays - whilst celebrating the birth of a homeless baby 2000 years ago? The rest of the year we can cope with the issue, but at Christmas it is just a bit too hard.

Just imagine that a couple of those younger homeless people we might see, surrounded by cardboard, in a redundant shop entrance, were named Joseph and Mary, and in their plight on the night of December 25th they had a baby. That's God's Immanuel, there in the shop doorway. How low could you go, God? Our attitude to the homeless and jobless in our society, especially at the moment, places this couple and their new child as low as they can go.

So this Advent as we prepare for the celebrations of Christmas, let's realize the enormity of God's act, not just what he did, but how he chose to do it. "Love came down at Christmas, love all lovely, love divine." A love that got itself dirty from the first minute, that joined humanity at its lowest, and rubbed shoulders with the humblest and the meekest throughout his stay with us. Let's celebrate that with thankfulness and in humility; it was all done for us.

Retiring collection for Care Network Uttlesford

Organised by Churches Together in Stansted

Rev'd Martin Cressey

We were very sad to hear that Martin died in September, aged 82 years. In the past, Martin and his wife Pamela offen used to lead worship at our church. In recent years, he suffered from Parkinson's Disease so we did not see them so offen, but they are



both held with much affection. Martin was one of the key figures in the formation of the United Reformed Church in 1972, and was a minister for 55 years. He held many major posts, including Moderator of the General Assembly in 1981, and Principal of Westminster College for 17 years. Ecumenism was always at the focus of his ministry, from his work at the Chapel of Unity in Coventry Cathedral whilst serving as a

Presbyterian Minister, through to his greatly-respected work with The World Council of Churches. He chaired the URC's World Church and Mission Department from 1977 to 1983, with visiting lectureships in New Zealand, South Korea and Samoa.

After his retirement, he continued to take services, and for ten years spent one day a week sorting clothes at the Oakington Immigration Centre. Martin was a lovely man, and a great source of wisdom, who will be much missed.
