


magine the state of mind of those Chilean miners, hearing the first attempted drilling miss the chamber where they were trapped deep underground. Later, one of the freed men, an Evangelical Christian, reported how they said now only God could get them out! Known for his professed faith, it was to him the others looked. As their foreman, he gave each a task. Try imagining the utter relief felt by those men at that glorious inrush of clean air; rescue had come nearer than had once seemed possible. Many hailed the freeing of those men as miraculous. In this instance, faith was a combination of hope and discipline engendered among the trapped miners by their temporary 'pastor', paralleled by the determination and skill of the engineers above ground working tirelessly to locate and free their fellows.

Yet, not always and in every case does even the most sublimely persistent faith give the result most desired. Not long after the Chilean miners' rescue, an accident happened in a New Zealand mine; where all the trapped men died. Rescuers could only work to recover the bodies. If we say that God helped the one set of miners, what was God doing for the others? Surely God does not play roulette or lottery with human lives? Some would argue for atheism as the only reasonable answer.

We must start from somewhere else, because this is a 'Why?' question: why, if God cares, does he not care for each and all equally? Rabbi Harold Kushner, in *When Bad Things Happen to Good People*, argues from his own personal tragedy that asking 'Why?' embitters. He declared instead, 'Now that this has happened, what shall I do?' Choosing this option opens the door of the beckoning future of the life now to be lived.

St John's Church has a regular collection point at the back of the church (which is open every day during daylight hours), where you can take breakfast cereals, tinned beans and tomatoes, tea, coffee, toiletries, ladies' and men's clothing, gloves, scarves and socks etc. Volunteers from the church take the goods to Whitechapel every couple of weeks.

On 24th January we welcomed our Pilots back to the first evening after Christmas. We began by talking about an important thing in all our lives - water. We looked at how often we use water, and how much we use. Then we watched a short film about disadvantaged children in Africa, who go a week at a time without water, and even then it's not clean or safe. We talked about how we wished we could give water to those in need. We then spent a while making cardboard wells, which are shown in the picture below.



We played various water related games, and then finished with a Bible story and some creative prayer. We all wrote what we'd like to thank God for on cut-out fish (to go with the water theme). The children really enjoyed the evening. If any of our church members have any children or grandchildren ages 5-14, then bring them along to pilots! They will have a lovely time and we would love to have them.



On Friday March 4th women from around the world will celebrate the Women's World Day of Prayer. The service has been written by the women of Chile. It is an appropriate theme, for bread is eaten at every meal and is very much part of everyday life. The women of Chile offer what it means to them as they share this service with us.

Jean Hackett, president of the National Committee of the Women's World Day of Prayer Movement, said: "This is always an exciting day as a great wave of prayer sweeps the world, beginning when the first service is held in Tonga and continuing around the world until the final service takes place, some 35 hours later, in neighbouring Western Samoa. By then the day will have been celebrated in over 170 countries and over 5,000 services will have been held in England, Wales and Northern Ireland."

Stretching from Peru to Antarctica, the Republic of Chile occupies a long narrow strip of land 2,640 miles long and 110 miles wide. It is a land of incredible contrasts. It also has the highest incidence of domestic violence in Latin America and most women suffer from discrimination in some form or other. Equal Opportunities is being pursued.

Although organised and led by women, this is essentially a day of prayer for everybody, as we demonstrate our solidarity with our sisters and brothers in other countries; all are welcome to attend. Further information can be found on the WWDP website at www.wwdp-natcomm.org.
