As Imagine will be available on December 25th I thought it would be an excellent opportunity to wish all my friends at Stansted Free Church a very happy and special day whatever you may be doing and whoever you are with. I am very lucky to be sharing this Christmas with two of my daughters and four of my grandchildren in Australia and I am sure it will be a time to remember, but I shall think of you all back home.

I have spent several Christmases in warm climates and one in Baghdad, where it was bitterly cold and the earth really did stand 'hard as iron'. We had a dust storm on Christmas Eve that covered everything in the house with a fine dust including the Christmas cake; but I never remember seeing as many stars in the skies as I did there. There was a military coup at the time and we were not allowed out after 7pm; but the expatriates - some of them British - decided to put on a pantomime and show everybody the stuff we were made of! So 'Goody Two Shoes' was launched to the bewilderment of most of the Iraqis and some Europeans, although the cast included Norwegian, Dutch, South African, German as well as Scots, Welsh and English. We rehearsed during the day and luckily had amongst us one of those pianists who can play anything by ear. Half the audience could not understand the concept of a Dame who was an old man and a young love-sick boy who was a girl!

I can't remember the story-line of Goody Two-Shoes but there was a Dame and two young lovers. We all sang and danced to the pop songs of the day and generally made fools of ourselves, but had a lot of fun despite the frightening times we were living in. I don't think my eldest daughter, who was four years old, was very impressed - she cried when she saw me up on the stage! It was difficult to find gifts, especially toys, to buy in the shops and food was not very plentiful but it didn't seem to matter, as we felt nearer to Bethlehem that Christmas than we had ever been, and it was a very memorable experience.




Representatives from Pilots at the Village Remembrance Day Parade and Service

We carried a team of World Vision staff to Hargeisa, where projects include drilling boreholes and rehabilitating clean water storage facilities, as well as providing emergency feeding. Give thanks with us that this flight was possible and please continue to pray for the safety of our team as they fly and for the teams travelling to Dadaab and into Somalia.
