

magine what it must have been like to be without mains electricity over the Christmas period. Many people in the South of England had to manage without power for several days. Imagine what it must have been like to have your house flooded, with your furniture and other belongings ruined. Many people had to evacuate their homes and find makeshift accommodation. Quite rightly we remembered them all in our prayers as we sat in our warm homes enjoying the usual festivities.

Now imagine being those wise men who travelled hundreds of miles to see a royal baby. There were no trains running, and the only light was that given by a bright star. Their accommodation would have lacked any home comforts. Today it is difficult to imagine what life was like then. However, traditionally during the festival of Epiphany we remember three events in the early life of Jesus. In addition to that arduous journey by the wise men, some Christians celebrate the baptism of Jesus, and some celebrate his first miracle at the wedding in Cana.

These events underline both the humanity and divinity of Jesus. The wise men were there to rejoice at the birth of a baby born as a human, but divinely conceived. They made an earthly journey guided by a divine satellite navigation system. Jesus was baptised by his cousin John in the Jordan just like many others had been, but the ceremony was made special by the anointment of the Holy Spirit. The wedding at Cana was just like any other wedding, until Jesus demonstrated his divinity by changing water into wine. Imagine what it would have been like to have witnessed any of those events.

The Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of God to the world, and it is an ongoing process. Are we prepared to make the sacrificial journey that brings us closer to God?
