

magine what fun I had at the pantomime recently with my extended family. It is a good job that we have a few children to justify our regular annual attendance! The panto' writers always manage to include a few big words that would be over the heads of the children. Imagine my surprise at hearing the Nasty Squire refer to his epiphany. He had just seen the error of his ways and decided to be nice rather than nasty to the tenants on his estate. It set me wondering about what is really meant by epiphany. Most of us are only aware of one particular epiphany, which traditionally occurs on 6th January, when the wise men worshipped the baby Jesus and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The coming of the Magi was seen as evidence that Jesus was meant for the gentiles as well as for the Jews.

In a more general sense an epiphany may be defined as a sudden manifestation of the essence or meaning of something. More simply put, we might describe it as seeing the light. The Magi saw the light literally in the form of a star, but more importantly they were privileged to be the first of many gentiles to see God revealed to mankind through his Son Jesus. Paul's encounter with God on the road to Damascus is a classic example of an epiphany. Most of us will remember less dramatic times when we have seen things in a new light. One of the joys of teaching is seeing the look on a student's face when the penny drops and they see the light.

Epiphanies come as a result of seeking the truth. In John 8:31 -32, Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." As we enter 2013 let's resolve to discover more of the truth so we can share in the experience of the Magi.
