

magine if she had known what would happen next! She had chosen a home by the sea 200 miles away from her daughter. The sea was crystal blue and the evenings of cool breezes made for splendid walks along the promenade as the sun slipped like a gleaming blood orange into the ocean. She had an aching in her heart, though, when she remembered her daughter far away on the other side of the country.

One day she knew soothing the dull ache was more important than relishing in the ocean's joy. She and her husband found a house nearer her daughter and moved back to the centre of the country. Within weeks she sought medical help for a persistent and debilitating pain in her tummy. The sad news that she had cancer was soon declared. Near her beautiful new home she discovered wonderful medical staff who helped her through the difficult time and there was great consolation in her daughter's constant presence.

Was it all planned? Sometimes, something tells us it is time to make a big change and make our preparations. Was it the same, I wonder, for our country's Methodist conferences when they carried out those great meditations on what our church is for? Easy to go to church week after week but sometimes you have to stop and take stock and ask if the church we have got is, as they say, "Fit for purpose".

The conference in 1999 adopted a paper 'Called to love and praise' which mirrored an earlier paper put to the same conference 62 years earlier. Both documents are wonderful ponderings on the nature of our church, well worth reading and deeply encouraging.

I am struck by what neither conference knew at the time – the imminent events of 1939 and those of 2001. Was God saying "a difficult time is coming, time to think where you are and be sure of your foundations as you face the future"?

Whether it be cancer, a war, or terrorism, before and through the devastation, God is there, however terrible the suffering and turning upside down of our familiar world. When our lives face threat of terrible change let us remember he walks with us and helps us prepare.
