Perhaps if we spent some time living in a refugee camp just outside Syria we might begin to get a sense of living without the everyday things of life.

Imagine how you would have felt if you had been the rich young man who asked Jesus what he had to do to inherit eternal life; he had obeyed all the Commandments since he was a boy. When you read the story in the gospels you get a sense of someone who had followed all the religious rules and was probably a pillar of Jewish society.

Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come and follow me." At this the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth. Mark 10:21-22.

Imagine what it would be like to give everything away that you owned, in order to follow Jesus. What might we secretly want to hold on to; what would we see as indispensable to our lives? Whatever road we choose to go down, we should always remember the answer Jesus gave to the disciples when they asked who could be saved:

"With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible with God." Mark 10:27b
