

magine, when you pray the Lord's Prayer, Jesus prays with you - said the insightful, former Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Michael Ramsey in his book *Be Still*. Metropolitan Anthony Bloom, of the Russian Orthodox tradition, in *Living Prayer*, comments that the Lord's Prayer 'is both a simple, yet also a difficult prayer'. Methodist, Neville Ward, wrote what is for me the most useful book I have ever read on prayer, *The Use of Praying*. His thinking on what we pray for when we ask for good for others, and for ourselves, removes all notions of prayer as being in any way magical.

Magical ideas wrongly imagine that we can manipulate whatever power there is we call 'God' into giving us what we want. Take the irate customer on the telephone to me in my Post Office days, who, when I refused to reduce her telephone bill, insisted: 'If I protest long enough, I'll get what I want!' Where prayer is concerned, the One to whom prayer is made is then construed as being like some immovable official to be badgered into submission.

Jesus tells a story of a feisty widow badgering a reluctant magistrate into giving her the justice she sought: 'If I don't give her redress,' he thought, 'she'll give me a black eye!' By this parable, Luke's Jesus teaches the reverse lesson: that God is not at all like that reluctant judge, but will speedily answer our plea for the Kingdom's rule to come about. The challenge, said Jesus, is whether there are people with the faith to persist in prayer and hope of that kingdom.

'What will the Son of Man find when he comes on earth?' asks Christ. 'Will he find people of faith?' How fair is it to imagine this as our response: 'Lord, I have faith, help me where faith falls short!'

News from the Church meeting

At the recent Church meeting, we discussed our Mission Pledge, which has now been agreed as follows:

- 1. **Embracing Renewal** Develop the life of the church starting from where we are, developing what we do best, but always prepared for change, however difficult we may find such change.
- 2. Nurturing Pilots Encourage a closer relationship between the church fellowship and the families of Pilots children and young people, by supporting Pilots special events.
- 3. **Refreshing Worship** Explore further, the possibilities of new ways of worship, such as Café Style.
- **4. Salt in our World** Find ways of reaching out to the wider community, to show folk that church goers are just ordinary people
- Healing our World -Support needs in the community, bearing in mind the already extensive involvement in charity, voluntary and local council of many of our members.
- 6. Declaring "We are Here" -'Market' ourselves through the hall as a mission asset for the church, making it more appealing.
- 7. **Being a Touching Place** Say to people, by what we do, 'we care about you'.
- **8. Alert to Family Need** Be more organized in visiting members who don't come very often or are sick.
- Open Heart Open Mind Strive to be a wider church, in losing prejudices and encouraging openness of outlook and attitude.
- 10. As One Church 'In Step' Continue working ecumenically, improving links and fostering joint ventures with the other local churches.

We are planning to discuss two or three of the above at each church meeting, to see how we are progressing. A simplified version will be displayed on the noticeboard in the hall which we hope will be informative for non-church people.
