

magine a church where bread making was a major concern and seen as part of 'being church'. Barbara Glassom, a Methodist Minister, had no idea what she was going to do as she was sent onto the streets of Liverpool to listen to the community within their own culture. She spent nearly a year immersing herself in the culture, listening to the people and their needs and the 'Bread Making Church' was born. Imagine a small Methodist Church in Polzeith, Cornwall that decided to completely change direction, change how it acted as church by reaching out to what had become its local community - surfers.

The Mission Shaped Intro Course we recently finished, and indeed the service we held on 13th May, called on us to use our imagination quite a lot, not least because some examples we saw of being church seemed a million miles away from our traditional views.

Archbishop Rowan Williams often uses the phrase 'a mixed economy' when he talks about church finding a way forward, a way to reach out to the community that exists around it. He talks about our established and traditional churches as having an important role to fulfil, but running alongside needs to be fresh expressions of being church, of reaching out to the community in the name of Jesus.

There is nothing new about this. Imagine you are one of the twelve disciples Jesus sent out into the community with the explicit instruction to "preach the kingdom of God and heal the sick." Luke 9:1-6. Would you be excited, scared, feeling you just hadn't got enough tools in the chest to do this, not trained up enough yet? The disciples had not been with Jesus very long and they were not 'trained up' to carry out Jesus' instruction, but, and it is a huge BUT, Jesus gave them power and authority to go out in His name.

We have that power and authority from Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, and we can do whatever the Lord asks us to do if we open ourselves up to Him, listen, and then act.

May the Lord bless you as you move forward in His name.

A note from our minister Special Church meeting 3rd July

Dear friends at Stansted Free Church

We are in exciting times for us as church, but they are also challenging times. We need to re-evaluate what we feel God is calling us to be involved in, here in Stansted. In June 2011 we held a special church meeting and began a journey, seeking a way forward under God's guidance. One of the things that was noted at this meeting was that if we didn't see an influx of people into our church within the next five years then a state of terminal decline might well have set in and would be very, very difficult to turn around.

Recently, we were part of a *Mission Shaped Intro* course in our church, which was held under the Churches Together in Stansted banner. Revd Paul Wilkin and I led the course, which offered challenging, but very helpful, insights into how some churches in our country have reached out to their communities; and this in turn has excited interest in some of you as to how we can best carry out mission in Stansted. We are also exploring how we can work more closely with our friends just up the hill at St John's.

We are holding an **open church meeting** at **8.00 pm on Tuesday 3rd July** in the church hall to discuss some of these ideas. In preparation there will be three 'Way Forward' Prayer Times. These will be in the foyer and the church and are on different days and at different times:

Tuesday 29th May 7.30 – 9.00 pm

Wednesday 13th June 10.00 – 11.30 am

Saturday 23rd June 11.30 am – 1.00 pm

You will be able to come and go as you please. There will be prayer stations and shared liturgy as well as times of quiet. Refreshments will be available half way through each session. The prayer times will be about the community around us. How can we interact with them? What needs are there in the community that are not already being met? Where might God already be working so that we can join in? What mission might we be able to do with our partner churches in Stansted?

There are many questions that need answering, but we will get nowhere if we don't do our homework, and above all if we don't pray together about all of this. I have chosen different days and times in the hope that most of us will be able to make at least one prayer session. The open church meeting on 3rd July will be led by Revd Stuart Veitch as I am away on leave that week. If we look at the opportunities that might arise from our prayers and exploration of the Way Ahead, and add to this the possibility of a new minister joining the team before too long, I truly believe we are in an exciting phase of our church's life.

May the Lord bless each and every one of us as we move forward together in Jesus' name.
