


magine that I couldn't imagine anything, that my creativity dried up and nothing but the same old idea just came back to me. I wonder if this ever happens to you?

Rev'd Jim Gill

On 1st February, Jim finally lost his nine year battle against cancer. He had been known to both the Methodist and URC congregations for many years as a local preacher, and for introducing them to the Whitechapel Mission. Ten years ago Jim became a Methodist minister, initially appointed for five years as a non-itinerant 'Minister in Local Appointment' to the Methodist churches in Chrishall and Ickleton, where he brought several young families into the church. He was then appointed as assistant minister to Bishop's Stortford, with responsibility for the Stansted Methodist



Church. We enjoyed Jim's energetic and inspiring leadership for only a couple of months before he was moved to the Harlow Circuit, but during that short time Jim encouraged us to pursue our links with the Stansted URC. We were very disappointed to loose Jim, but accepted that Harlow's need was greater than ours. Jim stayed in the Harlow Ecumenical Circuit, recently taking on the pastorate of Hatfield Heath URC.

We have known Jim, his wife Jean, and daughters Fiona and Pauline for over 30 years, as we were all members at Bishop's Stortford church back in the 1970s. Marion and Jim used to swap stories of their bad backs; Jean often sang with Harold Fisher, minister of the church for 13 years, and Marion sometimes accompanied them. Although he declared himself 'not at all musical', Jim was always there to support Jean, as he did the girls who learnt piano with Marion and took part in concerts. Often described as 'a breath of fresh air', Jim was greatly loved and respected by all who knew him and will be very much missed.
