The promise in Jesus's words is that "they shall see God". It is not normal to "see" God but if you recall the times when you have felt reassured in your faith, how often has it been as a result of contact with a good person through whom we catch a glimpse of the loving kindness and attention of our loving Father?

When we bring kindness and attention to a suffering person we are in a sense bringing God's love to them. One day you might see a person lying on the ground in our village. In a few months' time we hope that you will know where to find your nearest defibrillator and that you will have the confidence and training to use it.

A campaign has recently started in our village to fund one or two defibrillators for Stansted. If you are interested, come to the launch of the Stansted Churches' Lent Appeal to raise funds for the defibrillators at 7 pm on 4th March at St Teresa's; enjoy a free pancake or two and hear how you can support the campaign. One day soon you could help a person be 'pure in heart' and your swift action may help them to see God through your act of compassion.
