

magine being in the wilderness for forty days and nights. What would be the most difficult part to cope with? Perhaps it would be the shortage of food or the lack of shelter. Perhaps it would be the fear of being attacked by wild animals. I suspect that loneliness would also be quite high up on the list. Imagine being alone without any means of communication; mobile phones do not work in the wilderness! Most of us will never be in that situation, but Jesus was.

Imagine the rapid chain of events leading up to his time in the wilderness. First there was his baptism by John in the River Jordan. Then the Holy Spirit descended from heaven in the form of a dove. This was the physical sign of God's approval and affirmation. Next there was a voice from heaven giving verbal affirmation "You are my own dear Son. I am pleased with you."

Then it all appears to have gone wrong. Some translations say Jesus was led, but others are more dramatic, and say he was driven or even hurled by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness. Why did God put his Son through such a traumatic experience? It is for the same reason that Jesus was later nailed to a cross. The road to Calvary began on the day that a baby was born in Bethlehem. Jesus became a man in order to bear the brunt of our sinfulness and suffering.

During Lent it is traditional and often helpful to make token sacrifices, but imagine what it would be like to give one's whole life as a sacrifice. Jesus did just that. We no longer need to hunger and thirst or fear loneliness in the wilderness that so often envelopes us. Like Jesus we will be subject to the wiles of the Tempter, but like Jesus we have God on our side.


