We have that same Holy Spirit living inside each one of us. We have all the gifts and all the strength we need to be Jesus' modern day disciples; remember he has promised to be with us until the end of the age.

Let us be open to the power and moving of the Holy Spirit in all that we do and say. Let us learn from the past, but not be captive to it. Let us move forward in vision and love inspired by the Holy Spirit.

Churches Together in Stansted Food Bank

The CTS food bank scheme has slowly been gathering pace. The Free Church has donated around 10 boxes of food to local people through the Spangles Children's Centre in Lower Street. Other churches have done the same. We are waiting to see if demand picks up following the involvement of the CAB, which has contact with people who are not users of Spangles, such as single people in need and couples without children.

Contributions of non-perishable food continue to be needed. Supplies of long-life milk, breakfast cereals and fruit juice are low. Items should not be near their 'sell by' date. Donations may be left in the vestry on a Sunday or Wednesday morning. We are now able to buy fresh food using money that came from the district councillors' grant scheme. 2012 Harvest Donations

Firstly I would like to offer our apologies that this Thank You letter has taken so long. As you may, or may not, have been aware we have had a number of key personnel leave which meant many important tasks were delayed. Your donations are very important to us and we trust that you will understand and continue to support us this and forthcoming years.

This letter is in acknowledgment and thanks for the wonderful donations which you gave to the Harlow Foodbank. Altogether you collected 34.82 kg of food.

Your donations enable us to continue to provide food to local families and individuals in crisis. From April 2009 to March 2013 we have supplied three days' worth of nutritionally balanced food to 6,918 people. In this financial year alone the figure is 2,101 (1,456 adults and 645 children).

Without your support we would not be able to continue this important service to people in need in Harlow.
