

magine you live in constant fear for your life at the hands of a militia group, which will attack your village because it thinks you favour its opponents. Or imagine that because you have seen family and friends killed, the fear for your own life and that of your family has become so great that you flee your home and country to seek refuge in a strange place.

It is these people, including 42 million driven from their homes by conflict, that Christian Aid is putting the spotlight on this year in Christian Aid Week from 11th - 17th May.


What is Christian Aid doing to help? Working through its partner organisations 'on the ground' it gives emergency aid for refugees - providing, for example, malaria nets, cooking pots, and plastic sheeting for shelter. It is helping communities rebuild their villages, constructing reservoirs which are stocked with fish, and encouraging people to grow vegetables and keep animals. It also teaches people how to lobby authorities to provide services such as roads and water supplies.

In some countries which have seen years of conflict, it has set up humanitarian zones, where no one is allowed to bear arms. It offers psychological support for those traumatised by what they have lived through, and practical support to rebuild lives damaged by war.

In Christian Aid week, church members show their compassion for, and their solidarity with, those caught up in conflict by giving generously, both money and time, by acting (being an envelope collector) and by praying. Thank you for your support.
