

magine I was to say to you "Before the war....". Okay, but which war? It depends on which generation you belong to. We oldies know which war I would have meant, but would our grandchildren? For 'our war' finished getting on for 70 years ago. In 1945 the Boer war finished only just over 40 years before, but to me in my young days, it felt like a distant age.

So which war is the *before the war* referring to? Our grandchildren can choose from dozens of wars that have happened since 'our war'. Since 1945 British troops have been involved in Malaysia, Kenya, Cyprus, Korea, Egypt, Yugoslavia, Northern Ireland, Afghanistan and Iraq. So which war dead shall we remember this month? Should we hang our heads in shame; have we learnt nothing? I am not saying that all war is bad, it's too complicated to say that, but have we given peace a chance? Perhaps we did in Northern Ireland, but we certainly did not in Iraq.

It is, of course, right to remember with gratitude and sadness those who have given their lives or were injured over so many years and wars, and also their families But that surely is not enough; we have to gather out of all this pugnacity a determination to find new ways of dealing with human conflict that do not require us to go to war.

Perhaps we should pray along with Susan Durbar: **

Today we weep and mourn for the heritage we have lost and for the ones who died before they had fully lived.

Today we remember the sons and daughters of all humanity whom no guard could protect and who were killed or hurt in war.

Today we recall houses blown to rubble, and cities devastated by fire, nations brought to ruin and peoples destroyed.

Today we remember and let the silence fall....

And tomorrow we will pray that our cities will be guarded in peace, that our houses will be built in freedom, and that all our children will grow old.

And tomorrow we will speak even with our enemies, so that all will flourish and justice may come, and so that God's people will enjoy the rewards of peace, and never again pay the bitter price of war.




