

magine the perfect day, what would it be like, what would make your perfect day? Would it be the hazy, lazy day of autumn with mellow mists and tranquil air? Would it be a hot summer's day, lying back in a chair reading your favourite book with a glass to hand? Perhaps it would be a cold, crisp, snowy day when you could make footsteps in the virgin snow where no-one had stepped before; but whatever it might be, just for a moment imagine that perfect day for you and hold that thought in your mind.

The Apostle Paul, writing to a very dysfunctional Corinthian church about love, noted that "when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears." 1 Corinthians 13:10. So imagine if you can, what it might be like when Jesus, Perfection, returns; and rather than having heaven on earth, it becomes earth in heaven.

In some ways I find it hard to imagine what heaven might be like. Having watched scenes of grief in Wales following the loss of four miners, and seeing vivid images of flood waters as far as the eye can see devastating the lives of millions in Pakistan, heaven seems but words in the pages of a book. In the light of our broken world, imagine then what the outworking of the imperfect disappearing might be.

We read in the last book of the Bible: "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away"..... "the dwelling of God is with men, and He will live with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." Revelation 21: 1-4

Imagine that. No tears, no death, no pain as Perfection comes and the imperfect disappears.
