

magine what it is like being forced to leave your home. In truth, we don't need much imagination at present. We can see the pictures of the refugee camps all around the borders of Syria, and the migrants arriving in overcrowded boats on the shores of Mediterranean countries. We can see them moving across Europe. We know that our own community will be asked to receive Syrian refugees in the coming months and years. If we want to imagine what it is like being forced to leave your home, all we have to do is look at the despair on the faces of our contemporary refugees. I am glad and sad that we are giving our Christmas offerings to various appeals to help refugees, and that at our gift service we are collecting for the Whitechapel Mission to help the homeless in London.

Think of the Christmas story as it is imagined by both Luke and Matthew. Luke imagines Jesus' family uprooted from their home in Nazareth at the decree of the Roman Emperor to travel to Bethlehem, and when they arrive in Bethlehem, the only accommodation they can find for Jesus when he is born is a feeding box for animals. Imagine our contemporary refugees and then imagine the Christmas story again. Matthew imagines Jesus and his family uprooted because of the jealousy of a king and forced to flee into exile in Egypt. The holy family become refugees thrown upon the mercy of strangers in a foreign land. Imagine our contemporary refugees and then imagine the Christmas story again.

Why should we imagine the Christmas story in this way? It is because it saves our celebration of Christmas from becoming bland and comfortable; the Christmas story imagines the peace of God coming into the world through the vulnerable baby and living among the mess of the world and the disorder in our lives. Imagine God sharing our despair and trouble in the infant Christ; and in that moment of wonder, imagine the touch of healing for our wounds, a word of

forgiveness for the hurt we cause each other, and being embraced by consolation in our sorrow. Imagine despair turning to hope and sadness into joy; and then with open hearts welcome Christ again.

God bless you all this Christmas and into the New Year.
