magine life on board ship, crammed in with masses of other human beings, passing through the wildest seas, with just a bucket for your toilet and only sea water to wash with. During a recent visit with the U3A to the Dunbrody Famine Ship at New Ross in Ireland, we were asked to imagine life on board one of these so called 'coffin ships'. For the Irish victims of the nineteenth century potato blight the faint prospect of a new life in America was a better fate than starving on your small-holding in County Wexford. Many of the emigrants went on to live very successful lives in their new country; but many more perished from diseases like cholera on the way. It isn't so hard to imagine such a situation in our own time, when more and more refugees are drawn to our attention by the media. There they are, these modern coffin ship passengers, risking drowning, starvation and disease as they try and make their way to a safe haven.

As nations deliberate on how to best ignore the people beached up on their shores, we might be reminded of the man lying bleeding on the Jericho road (Luke chapter 10). Those very religious people, Priest and Levite, justifying themselves maybe with important business to get on with and concerned not to defile their bodies by touching a wounded man, famously walked on the other side. Only the reviled Samaritan took pity on the man and continued to provide for his needs after he had been rescued. "Who was the neighbour?" still challenges us just as it did the experts in the law and we might want to consider the implications for us and our society of Jesus' next words "Go and do likewise".

Who are acting like Priests and Levites in the face of our modern Jericho road (or sea) and who are still acting with pity in a Samaritan-like way?
