This is not you of course, because it is the antithesis of the Christian view of life; but, because it demonstrates the opposite to what we should be, it is a reminder of the importance of thanksgiving.

In the season of Harvest Thanksgivings we will reflect again on the generosity of God and our appreciation of the human toil that brings such an abundance of food to our tables. However, recent events are reminders that we are stewards of God's generosity, and the arbiters of justice to those whose toil we so often forget. When we see on our TV screens asylum seekers surviving on meagre daily handouts, and cows being walked through supermarkets, we are reminded that we are called to love our neighbours and to ensure God's generosity is not meant to stop at us, but is for all. Our thanksgiving needs to be the springboard for action.

Yet our thanksgiving should not just embrace the food for our tables. Each day is a gift from God, and we should be thankful for every one of them, and all God's generosity with the gifts of love that should make us Christians, of all people, the most thankful on earth. Sadly we have something of a reputation for being negative and killjoys, which hardly demonstrates the thankfulness that should run parallel to loving "The Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind". So may this year's Harvest Festival be a reminder of our calling to share with our friends and neighbours, the spirit of thankfulness to our generous God.
