

magine a very tense or worrying situation. You might feel angry at someone, or just frustrated about how things are going with your day. Imagine you just got out of bed the wrong side! Dr Brian Alman suggests one technique for changing the way one reacts to troublesome situations or an unsettled mind is by using cues. You can call upon them at any time to help you to focus on your good intentions and readjust your mind. One of his patients calls to mind a yellow balloon that summons up an image of a peaceful and beautiful time in her childhood. Cues are just like the prompt to remind you to say your line in a play but in his notion they are cues intended to readjust our behaviour or emotions.

As Christians we are also subject sometimes to moods and worries, but we have sources of cues, such as the Bible and great hymns, that help us through the troubled times. Sometimes Bible passages can take us back to peaceful and calm times in the past. One night I recalled the baptismal song we used to sing in the Presbyterian church in the 1960s: The Lord bless you and keep you, the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious unto you, the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.

This month Tear Fund are running a competition called What's your favourite Bible moment? You are asked to submit your favourite passage and say where you would most like to listen to it and why. Ben Cohen gives a suggested example: Malachi 4 v 2 But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays. You can imagine this might come to you while you are sitting watching the sun rise in a favourite picturesque spot. Regardless of whether your passage is a competition winner or not, isn't it a lovely idea to summon up special scriptural passages and focus our minds and our whole selves on them, re-enforcing their meaning for us?

Imagine that when we are suffering or see our loved ones passing through deeply troubling times, these special passages can help us direct our love and care towards ourselves or our loved one and beckon God's peace and healing power to dwell in the situation.

I am brought back to the words that brought me peace and a sense of his grace so long ago: The Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace. I wonder where those little babies are now? I imagine God's countenance is still being lifted upon them as they live their adult middle-aged lives.
