
"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."

These words of Jesus tell us that if we meet the needs of others, we are doing it for Christ. They are at the heart of what motivates Christian Aid and its supporters. With our financial assistance, the words are put in to action. Refugees are given food, clean water, shelter, health care, advice and comfort, no longer just in Europe but throughout the world. This year there will not be a house-to-house collection in Stansted in Christian Aid Week, but there are fund-raising events happening throughout the year. 
## STANSTED MESSY CHURCH INK CARTRIDGE RECYCLING
