

magine the aroma of the Michaelmas daisies dancing in the gentle rain outside my window! The seasons have moved on from the warm summer as I endlessly chase late payers of Link adverts. Rather ironic as this Friday was the feast of St Michael and All Angels, a day on which debts are to be paid. Epstein's sculpture outside Coventry Cathedral vividly depicts St Michael slaying the devil, but in our evil times the devil seems far from being slain.

In a dark mood at Pentecost, Dr Giles Fraser, Parish Priest at St Mary's, Newington questioned whether he had really received the Holy Spirit (BBC radio 4 recently). Southwark had just been terrorised, his daughter just escaping involvement, he had suffered a massive heart attack and from his hospital bed had watched the smoke of a tower block billowing. A fellow minister brought him words from 2 Corinthians "We have this treasure in clay jars." 'How can this help me?' thought Fraser 'We are so vulnerable, easily broken, damaged or destroyed. What can I take from this?' As he pondered, he thought maybe he had received the Holy Spirit after all, but in a way that revealed to him that all he had belongs to God and not to him.

As Fraser says "We can despair, or we can take advice from Paul's wisdom. There is a way to place our heart beyond the reach of destruction; by shifting the centre of gravity in our lives to outside of ourselves we can find liberation from the fear of death, from self-absorption, from despair". As Paul reminds us We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed, perplexed but not in despair, persecuted but not abandoned, struck down but not destroyed." Let us take encouragement from Paul this Michaelmas and believe the devil will be overcome and that like Paul we should not fret or worry. If courage and confidence in God's victory is enough for Paul so can it be for Giles Fraser and us.

## **Church Deacon Vacancy**

We have six deacons, representing the church members, who have been elected for an initial term of six years.
