Over the past weeks, farmers have been gathering in the harvest; the end of a cycle of care that goes back to last autumn. We shall be celebrating our harvest festival, remembering the hard work and concern that goes into producing the food we eat. For some of us, it may be the only time we stop and think about where our food comes from. Do we take our daily food for granted? I guess not, if we have visited a food bank recently, or we live in the famine struck areas of East Africa, or we are part of the food industry. We live in a strange world where some of us worry about whether our food is healthy or not while others continually worry whether they will eat or not. Wouldn't it be good if all could eat without worrying, like the tits coming to our bird feeder? Can we imagine a world like that? Do we not believe that in God's providence and with proper human care, all may freely eat?

When Jesus imagined care-free eating for all, he added a rider: "But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness." Another word for righteousness is justice. Only through ensuring that living wages are paid, social welfare is adequate, trade is fair, and climate change is tackled will we ensure that all will eat without worrying. So let's celebrate the harvest with thankful hearts and a renewed commitment to creating a world where all may live free of the fear of hunger.
