

magine three teenage scouts creating the first fake news. Our mission, intended to earn us an important Scout badge, was to scale the Scottish mountain Ben More. One of the three scamps, a handy photographer, had the bright idea of standing the other two on a rock and by crouching low enough in the heather, he could falsely portray my brother Dennis and me on the summit of the mountain. Of course it didn't wash with the scoutmaster back in the scout hall and we didn't get our badges.

We had given up the climb when the going got rough, and got downhearted when the first false peak turned out to be nowhere near the top. Perhaps August is a bit like that, if we think of a year being for each of us a mountain to be climbed. August might be the part of the mountain that is particularly gruelling, a very tough part of the climb. There are no spectacular views, no awesome drops over cliff edges that spur the mountaineer on. The special feasts of the Christian year seem remote right now.

Last week, in the Bible notes I am using, the reading told of a small company of elders and leaders who accompany Moses' climb up the mountain. At a certain point they behold a mystic vision of God and their leader Moses bids them stay while he forges ahead to meet God in the cloud shrouding the peak.

In his commentary Rev'd Dr George Bailey recalls his own climbing experience of reaching the summit only to share the discovery of so many climbers that the summit is just a false one.

As Scouts we gave up at the first hurdle; but for Bailey the false peak opens up an exhilarating and enlarged understanding "of the size and height of the mountain, of realising that your first vision was too small to take it in. Yet, whilst you were struggling up the path, fixing your eyes on what you thought was the summit, that goal had actually been immensely helpful in motivating you to push ahead".

Bailey quotes Gregory of Nyssa's insight; Moses and the elders do indeed see something of God, but never all of Him, for "the divine is by its very nature infinite, enclosed by no boundary". Whether we are on the nursery slopes or venturing fearlessly up into the cloud, let us be cheered by the immensity of God, and that this immense unfathomable God is interested in each one of us - even if we don't deserve our badges!
