magine being on a retreat where you don't see anybody for five weeks and the only words you have are those running around in your head. There is only so much time you can spend appreciating the beauty of the arid desert scenery. It gets fiery hot by midday - the air is shimmering, the sun is pressing on your skin like a massive weight relentlessly burning your arms in the places where the thin linen sheet does not cover them.

It seemed so simple back in the temple when I said "Didn't you know I have to be in my father's house" and then events started happening fast; that strange experience of the Spirit descending on me when my cousin baptised me. What was it John said? "A voice calling in the wilderness, prepare the way, make the paths straight" and now here I am led by that Spirit into this very wilderness place between Jordan and Jerusalem. I haven't much time on earth and yet here I am spending 40 days just being in the wilderness. Is that a waste? Should I be back in the market place preaching, teaching and doing good - practical Christianity?

So many questions come to mind and possible strategies haunt me. You know them well "If you are really the Son of God..." and yet these thoughts are just so much noise. It is only when I give myself to the silence that I hear my Father clearly again. A still small voice. Only when I quieten the relentless noise that I allow to battle away in my head can I hear "the voice of one calling in the wilderness" and that is the reality, not the plans and strategies, the trying to think through a way to progress the religion.

The only way to be free and to free others is to constantly come back to that still small voice of one calling in the wilderness and then to make the way straight, straight all the way to Calvary!
