When I hear Thomas and George Ecclestone named, I wonder what impact the bitter news of their loss had on their sister Mary. She worshipped with us for many years and we remember her fondly (even for her energy in barn-dancing right up to advanced years!). Imagine how she might have felt as she twirled around the dance floor in our own times, maybe reflecting how different it would have been if the two boys could have been swung across the floor towards her.

The Great War didn't turn out to be the war that ends wars. There are so many continuing conflicts right at this moment; South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo, to name two that are not constantly in the headlines. It is easy to despair, but Jesus says:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

John 14 v 27

Do the words ring hollow when we survey the current world scene? The world does not seem to be able to give any kind of peace. Perhaps that is the irony of Jesus' words. If we expect the world to change, prison camps to disappear, state sponsored murders to stop, or safe zones to remain safe, we are under an illusion. Let it begin with me, the well known song says. Yes of course, but only as we individually (and collectively) keep alert for the peace that Jesus alone leaves with us and gives us. That peace passes all understanding but we must still be ready to accept it, make it ours, and through us take it to our world.
