ALPHA COURSE IN STANSTED



An Alpha course is being held in Stansted. Alpha is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith. Each talk focuses on a different question and is designed to encourage a conversation where people of any faith or none can express their own views and listen to others' points of view. It is aimed at those who attend church but would like to understand more and ask questions, as well as those who have no church connection. It is an opportunity to cut through negative headlines and stereotypes, and to find out what the Christian faith is really about and how it helps people in their everyday lives.

Two identical *Taster Sessions* (including a meal, a 15-minute film and discussion) are planned for **Monday 28**th **January** 7.30 - 9.00 pm and **Wednesday 30**th **January** 12.30 - 2.00 pm at the Day Centre. There will be an opportunity to find out more about the course content, and to put forward any questions you would like to hear answered during the course. The Alpha Course (Part 1) will be continuing over the following five weeks (either daytime or evening). There will be an opportunity to do Part 2 later for those who are interested.
