

magine a glorious summer day. Families enjoying a seaside holiday watch the little boats' sails with the sailors soaking up the sun on deck; gardeners sit back to admire the fruit of their labours. I found a bundle of seed packets this year and sowed them in the hope some might come up. I provided soil, moisture and warmth and everything needed for growth, but the seeds had not been stored properly and failed to sprout. The fact is, a gardener does not actually grow plants; he or she facilitates the growth that is beyond the gardener's direct control. The gardener must work hard, digging and fertilizing, sowing and watering, weeding and pruning then, with the right conditions, the plants will produce a colourful and fruitful display.

Similarly, a sailor cannot produce the necessary wind to move a boat. A sailor practises sailing skills that harness the gift of wind, but there is nothing the sailor can do to make the wind blow (Into the Silent Land by Martin Laird). The sailor must work hard to learn the correct rigging and understand how to harness the wind, and then the boat can bring the sailor home.

Jesus tells Nicodemus "the wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." (John 3.8)

Our task is to rig our spiritual sails through worship, prayer, Bible study and fellowship, so that we are ready to sail where God's Spirit blows; or if you prefer the garden analogy, we must tend our spiritual garden so that it provides the right conditions for the seeds of the Spirit to grow and produce the fruit of God's love.
