We face many challenges about the future of our life together in God's world: pollution, inequality, conflict and so forth. We cannot really hope to meet those challenges unless we accept the Spirit of inner renewal that God's spirit gives us.

Imagine you are breathing in that transforming Spirit; he is life and health.
