As we remember the joy of summer days, sunshine and laughter, holidays and al-fresco dining, we close our curtains, turn up the heating and already look forward to the warmer, lighter days of Spring which will herald new life and possibilities.

We may not like the cold nights, short days, bare trees and icy roads, but it is part of the blessing of God's gift in creation that autumn and winter confront us with our mortality and remind us to treasure the life we have. We take time to remember people we have known and loved, who died having left their mark for good on us and on the world. And we give thanks to God, who promises us that death is not the end but the pathway to a new and eternal springtime. May the Lord bless all our remembering with peace and his Spirit inspire us to live each moment with joyful appreciation and anticipation.
