

magine what it must have been like to be a monk in one of the monasteries that dominated so many medieval towns. Imagine getting up at 2 am in order to attend Matins and then three hours later for Lauds and Prime.

Last month some of us from Stansted and Abbey Lane chose a more agreeable time for the WEBS outing to Bury St Edmund's. Sadly we were nearly 500 years too late to join the Benedictine monks for any of the their daily offices in the Abbey Church. By way of contrast, before exploring the Abbey legacy, we visited the Grade 1 listed Unitarian Meeting House complete with its box pews and central pulpit. Its roots go back to the Act of Uniformity in 1662, when many worshippers rejected the new Book of Common Prayer. The present building was completed in 1711, and over 300 years later it is still used for worship and as a community resource. Imagine what it must have been like in those early days sitting through long sermons on those hard wooden pews without any heating!! However, it must have been even more uncomfortable for the Benedictines in the Abbey 200 years earlier. Thanks to Henry VIIIth the Abbey Church is in ruins, but we were able to visit two other magnificent churches that survive within the grounds of the Abbey; one of them became the cathedral and the other, St Mary's, claims to be the largest parish church in England. Its hammer beam 'angel' roof is truly awesome, and a modest slab marks the grave of Mary Tudor, Henry's sister.

This visit was a reminder that church buildings are the result of our instinctive desire to have a place to worship God. However, in some churches, the form of that worship has changed, and some buildings no longer exist. Is that a cause for concern? No, God is far bigger than any church building, and our relationship with him is not dependent on architecture. As we sit in our comfortable chairs on a Sunday morning, let us reflect and give thanks for what that relationship means to us.
