

magine Jesus had given in to temptation. Luke's Gospel tells how, after being led into the wilderness following his baptism, Jesus was tempted by the devil three times: firstly, to turn stones into bread to satisfy his burning hunger; secondly, to seize for himself in an instant all worldly power and glory; thirdly to throw himself off a high place to prove the truth of God's word.

If Jesus had divinely satisfied his hunger, he would not have been fully human, God-with-us, and we would not have the assurance that God has shared and understands our suffering and pain. There would be no true incarnation or gospel (good news) for the poor.

If Jesus had ruled with human power and authority, he would not be the Servant King. He would have entered Jerusalem on a warrior's steed, not a humble donkey and there would be no Palm Sunday or Maundy Thursday to turn the world's expectations upside down.

If Jesus had leaped into the void to prove God would save him from death, he might have been saved, but he would not have wrought salvation for all people through his faithful obedience to death on a cross. There would be no Good Friday and no crucifixion.

Praise God that Jesus did not give in to temptation. He depended on the word of God; he trusted in God the Father to feed him and provide for all his needs; he gave God alone the glory and power; and he willingly gave his own life that we might live. Through Jesus we have faith and hope and resurrection.

We thank you, Lord, for showing us our Saviour; We thank you, Lord, and praise your holy name.
