How do you imagine the discussion will go? Maybe start with a review of how we "loved the Lord our God with all our soul and with all our heart" and then the specifics of how "we loved our neighbour as ourselves"? That might be tough so let's not look at it too closely. We could reflect on George Orwell's words back in 1942. Martial Petain had just attributed France's fall to the people's love of pleasure. "If only!" mused Orwell and suggested that far from pleasure, the common man struggled to achieve what Petain's pals regarded as the "bare minimum without which human life cannot be lived at all": enough to eat, medication to survive, and enough energy to face tomorrow. In 2011 how little has changed. Just look at Somalia! We have the resources to solve it; we just need the will to do it. Imagine if we focused our attention and solved it in 20 years! Orwell went on to say "The major problem of our time is the decay of the belief in personal immortality. It cannot be dealt with while the average human being is drudging like an ox or shivering in fear". Imagine - Orwell said that nearly 70 years ago! His opinion was to deal with basic human needs first and then move to the spiritual. Reminiscent of Jesus feeding the five thousand before preaching to them maybe? Worth thinking about how we really do love our neighbours as ourselves.
