When she returned to Vienna her English class teacher asked the students to describe 'a great holiday experience'. My friend entitled hers 'A trip down the river Stort'!! You could have knocked me down with a paddle. But that was the day we shared - 'the Wind in the Willows' just for us, blue skies, Ratty and Mole, scuttling in and out of the water, reeds waving in the breeze, a little bit of heaven 'eternity in an hour'. We've all had those 'one-off' days and now with holiday adventures (perhaps over) why not imagine next Sunday might be one? So I'll try and say with the Psalmist, as I leave home:

"I was glad when they said unto me Let us go unto the house of the Lord"

And once there with you, and with Peter at the Transfiguration (what a 'one-off')

"Lord it is good for us to be here".
